Individuals eligible for this scholarship shall be enrolled as full-time Stony Brook University matriculated students in good standing and participating in any program on either the east or west campus, who identify with the goals of the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender or Queer (LGBTQ) campus community, and satisfactorily complete all requirements of the application listed below.

Students applying for the scholarship are required to complete an application and submit the following materials for Selection Committee consideration:

- Official academic transcript from the past year.
- At least two, and no more than three letters of recommendation, two of which should be from an instructor/professor.
- A one-page, typed, double-spaced personal statement describing yourself.
- A 500-word, typed, double-spaced essay on one of the following:
 - 1) What are your goals and plans for service to the LGBTQ community?
 - 2) Personal statement describing your LGBTQ role model(s) and your plans for becoming a role model in the future.
 - 3) Discuss the impact of sexual orientation of your life.

Financial need, based on FAFSA may be taken into consideration. (Applying for scholarship gives permission to review financial records.) Preference will be given to citizens and/or permanent residents of the United States. This is a one-year scholarship. Students must reapply for consideration for subsequent years. The award will be posted to the student account to be used toward educational expenses, and will be disbursed in equal payments, Fall and Spring. Applicants will be notified by mid July about the award.
